Benefits of Participation in Early Adopters

- Early access to ECOSTRESS data products* (potentially over a partner-specified region of interest) via LP.DAAC
- Engagement / discussion opportunities with ECOSTRESS Science Team
- Opportunity to have your use case and input integrated into a science and applications traceability matrix to understand future mission requirements and observables relating to thermal infrared data

Expectations

- Partner to participate in brief discussions (mix of phone / email) on specific use cases of ECOSTRESS data
- Partner may be asked to provide an additional 1-page or quad chart of schedule and work plan of activities pertaining to ECOSTRESS data
- Partner makes a reasonable effort to be responsive by email regarding requests on your activity
- Partner agrees to discuss and coordinate early on regarding any plans to submit reports or other publications relevant to ECOSTRESS data**
- Partner agrees to provide feedback to ECOSTRESS team related to data usability, quality, uncertainty, and access through mechanism / formats provided by ECOSTRESS team
- If Partner would like to share any datasets or products beyond the Early Adopters group, please ask that person to share their use case at ecostress.jpl.nasa.gov/applications and obtain and Earthdata login

* Please note that we reserve the right to discuss your science or other type of application of the data prior to inclusion into the Partners Working Group. All data requests are considered in the context of limited resources and processing capability. While ECOSTRESS is currently a 1-year nominal mission, we are also looking for ways to demonstrate value of our data to a community that is broader than science users.

** Early release data are provisional and NOT intended for science analysis and are considered beta products. Should your work lead to something you feel is publication-worthy in peer-reviewed or grey literature, we ask that you discuss and coordinate with us.
